SUBJECT : **IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 6-YEAR SRA GAD AGENDA
FROM THE CALENDAR YEAR 2024 TO 2029**

WHEREAS, Section 14, Article II of the 1987 Constitution declares the State policy that recognizes the role of women in nation-building, and ensures the fundamental equality before the law of women and men;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7192, the Women in Development and Nation Building Act, which was signed into law on February 12, 1992, promotes and ensures the integration of women as full and equal partners of men in development and nation-building;

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 273 dated September 8, 1995, the Philippine Plan for Gender-Responsive Development (PPGD) 1995-2025, is a long-term plan to fully integrate gender and development (GAD) concerns into the whole development process. It holds all heads of government agencies, with the assistance of their respective GAD Focal Point System (GFPS), primarily responsible for the institutionalization and mainstreaming of GAD in their agencies;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9710, the Magna Carta of Women (MCW), approved on August 14, 2009, reinforces the role of women in nation-building, promotes empowerment of women, and ensures equal opportunities and access for women and men to resources and development results and outcome. It endeavors to eliminate discrimination against women in keeping with the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) and other international instruments through the development of plans, policies, programs, measures, and mechanisms to address discrimination and inequality in the economic, political, social, and cultural life of women and men;

WHEREAS, the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW), through Memorandum Circular No. 2018-04, provides the guidelines and procedures in the formulation,



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implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of the multi-year GAD Agenda as the basis for the annual GAD Plans and Budgets of agencies. It will provide agencies with direction in setting and monitoring their GAD initiatives toward the achievement of gender equality and women's empowerment (GEWE) goals;

WHEREAS, the SRA GAD Focal Point System (GADFPS) prepares a GAD Agenda in compliance with PCW Memorandum Circular No. 2018-04;

WHEREAS, the SRA GAD Agenda is the 6-year (2024 – 2029) term plan of the Sugar Regulatory Administration that lays out the action plans of the agency to close the gender gaps between women and men in the sugarcane industry through effective and efficient gender mainstreaming. This will serve as a guide in the formulation of the SRA's annual Gender Plan and Budget (GPB) starting in 2024 until 2029;

WHEREAS, the SRA GAD Agenda recognizes the various commitments of the Philippine government to advance women's rights and eliminate gender discrimination under various gender-related laws, notably, the Philippine Plan for Gender Responsive Development (1995-2025), the Beijing Platform for Action (the resulting document from the Fourth World Conference on Women in Beijing, China in 1995 adopted by the United Nations), Women in Development and Nation Building Act (Republic Act No. 7192), Anti-Sexual Harassment Act of 1995 (Republic Act No. 7877), Anti-Violence Against Women and their Children Act of 2004 (Republic Act No. 9262), Safe Spaces Act (Republic Act No. 11313) and the Magna Carta of Women (Republic Act No. 9710);

WHEREAS, under Section 36 of Republic Act No. 9710, otherwise known as the Magna Carta of Women (MCW), SRA shall adopt gender mainstreaming as a strategy to promote women's rights and eliminate gender discrimination in the industry's systems, structures, policies, programs, processes, and procedures. To fulfill this mandate, SRA GADFPS has formulated the GAD Strategic Framework and GAD Strategic Plan;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved, to approve and execute the 6-Year (2024-2029) SRA GAD Agenda in all SRA and SIDA policies, programs, and activities as shown in the attachment hereof starting January 1, 2024 until December 31, 2029;

RESOLVED, FURTHER, that all concerned Deputy Administrators, Managers, Division Chiefs, SIDA and other Committee Heads, Section Chiefs, Officers-In-Charge, and Chairperson of GAD Focal Point System (GFPS) shall ensure the proper dissemination and implementation of this Memorandum Circular.

GENDER ISSUES IN SUGARCANE PRODUCTION

Modernization of farm practices could improve production efficiency; however, lack of access to technology and information, outdated technical skills, and limited resources remain to be greater challenges for small sugarcane farmers, especially rural women. According to 2013 data of DAR, rural women comprised only 29% of the total number of 2,303,454 agrarian reform beneficiaries (ARBs) provided with Certificate of Land Ownership Award. Aside from gender issues on land ownership, women living in rural areas are disproportionately affected by poverty and food & water insecurity as a consequence of discrimination they encounter when it comes to the following:

- Household or farm income
- Access to farm machinery
- Access to extension services and training
- Education and health
- Access to resources and services to improve productive and reproductive work
- Control over resources
- Participation in decision-making

In addition to these identified gender gaps, women in sugarcane farms and mills/refineries, including bioethanol plants, have limited knowledge about their development roles in nation-building as embodied in the Republic Act No. 9710, otherwise known as the Magna Carta of Women (MCW) and protection rights under the Republic Act No. 9262 or the Anti-Violence Against Women and their Children (VAWC) law, Republic Act No. 11313 or the Safe Spaces Act, and other gender-based laws.

To address these disparities in gender relations of women and men in sugarcane production, the Sugar Regulatory Administration (SRA), as a government arm responsible for promoting the general welfare of small sugarcane farmers and other marginalized stakeholders in the industry, strives to achieve the following aspirations:

- ✓ Enhance the agricultural production capacity of both rural women and men.
- ✓ Increase women's access to and control over agricultural technologies.
- ✓ Encourage more women to adopt new technologies or high-yielding crops.
- ✓ Increase the involvement of women in agricultural decision-making.
- ✓ Increase the proportion of women who receive credit assistance.
- ✓ Improve the leadership capacity of rural women involved in farmer's organizations, cooperatives, and other similar groups.

These goals aim to empower women and men in rural communities by giving them greater access to resources and opportunities in the agricultural sector, and by increasing their participation in decision-making processes.

Further, SRA is committed to raising the level of knowledge by equipping women and men with the appropriate and right information regarding gender and development (GAD) as it relates to production efficiency in the household, sugarcane farms, and the workplace.

SRA GAD AGENDA (2024 – 2029)

The SRA GAD Agenda is the 6-year (2024 – 2029) term plan of the Sugar Regulatory Administration that lays out the action plans of the agency to close the gender gaps between women and men in the sugarcane industry through effective and efficient gender mainstreaming. This will serve as a guide in the formulation of the SRA's annual Gender Plan and Budget (GPB) starting in 2024 until 2029.

The 6-year term SRA GAD Agenda is a product of the Gender Mainstreaming Evaluation Framework (GMEF) validation report conducted by the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) from October 20 to 29, 2021 when SRA received a notable increase in the score from **27.65** baseline score to **35.1** in the updating and showed a remarkable increase in score which, in turn, also increased the overall level from level 1 in 2019 to level 2 in 2020 (Installation of Strategic Mechanisms). The SRA GAD Agenda is also an offshoot of various planning sessions attended by GAD Focal Point System (GFPS) members:
